2024 Advent Project Report

Thank you to the 23 FUMC-CP families who donated to this year's Advent Project. Between you, my neighbors, United Women in Faith and California Society of the Daughters of Colonial Wars we donated \$2,800 worth of gift cards to the Casa de Vida and TAY shelters in Chatsworth. We also donated Christmas stockings for those at Casa de Vida and Merry Christmas Snack Boxes to TAY.

What started out as our church donating to The Woodlands changed when I was making arrangements for the pastor and I to deliver our donations.

Here is the back story: In October, George and I went to visit two small shelters in Chatsworth. Both are converted houses on the same property. One is a 48-bed family shelter housing mostly single mothers with children up to 18 years of age who have escaped violent situations. The other is a 38-bed Transitional Aged Youth shelter for kids 18 – 24.

When George and I left those two shelters they tugged at our heartstrings. We believed because of the size of the shelters and the size of our congregation we would be a good fit for them.

Because we had already told the congregation we would donate to The Woodlands we decided to continue but thought we would change to those two shelters next year.

While making arrangements with Hope the Mission for the pastor and I to deliver our donation, the lady I was working with said this, "Good Shepherd Church is blessing all 189 children at The Woodlands this weekend with gifts from their wish list so would you be willing to donate to two small shelters; Casa de Vida and TAY?"

Those two were the same two George and I visited in October. After discussing it with the pastor we said we were willing to donate to them. Between the two churches all three local shelters where children reside will all have a Christmas gift. That is over 250 children!!

Christmas Stocking; Christmas Card; Cross Sticker; Trail Mix; Candy Cane; Meaning of a Candy Cane; 31 - \$25 Ralph, Walmart and/or Dollar Tree Gift Card

FOR TAY (38 Transitional Aged Youth - 18-24) Christmas Card; 38 - \$25 Target Gift Cards; Cross Sticker; Merry Christmas Snack Box; Trail Mix; 2 Oreo Cookies; 8 Pieces of Candy; Candy Cane

While the pastor and I were touring the shelters when delivering the donation, we saw that the TAY shelter did not have a Christmas tree. Since we had some leftover gift cards, we gave them \$200 to buy a Christmas tree and some decorations.

We gave them gift cards to buy them. At the Administrative Council meeting Anita and Louis Parrinello offered to donate a Christmas tree they had in storage they no longer could use.

On Friday the 13th the Parrinello's and I drove to the shelter. They donated 2 Christmas trees, two Christmas tree skirts and two Santa Claus pictures. The gift cards we gave the shelter were used for lights for one tree and decorations for the tree and walls.

Last night the staff put up one of the trees so when the children woke up this morning they saw a decorated tree. I asked if the kids liked it. The Program Manager said, "They LOVED it!"

Thanks to all of you for being so kind. Your generosity put smiles on many faces and made Christmas special for almost 100 people!!

Administrative Committee Reports

Financial Update: Our finances continue to hold up even though we're spending almost double what was budgeted in 2024 for facilities upkeep. We are blessed to have an Endowment Fund at First UMC which was funded by an estate gift many years ago. We cannot use any part of the \$80,000 principal without a vote of the church membership, but any investment earnings can be used to support the budget. We have had a wonderful investment year, pulling out \$8000 in the spring and another \$8000 in December which will go into the budget in late 2024! If anyone is doing estate planning, please consider adding the FUMCCP Endowment Fund to your list of beneficiaries. It's a wonderful and very impactful way to GIVE and support the never-ending life of our church!!

Facility Update: We still have a good list of projects we are working to complete. As noted in previous reports we continue to work on how best to convert the Fellowship Hall lights to LEDs. Louis Parrinello has taken over this project and he has been able to find lower cost ways to complete the project. It now looks like it will cost around \$6,000 and we think it will be completed in the first quarter of 2025. The other major repair is the remaining asphalt shingles which are about 40 years old on the Fellowship Hall roof. We've replaced about half of them in the last few years and now the strong winds have blown off more of the original shingles. We don't have the \$10,500 to complete the replacement of the remaining original shingles so for the moment we'll do a patch which will cost about \$1500. We are going to proceed with a \$900 job to set up a way to track our solar electrical generation on a phone app. The trimming of the three pine trees on the Sherman Way side of the Fellowship Hall will have to wait until next year. The sanctuary ceiling repair (\$1200) and the cleaning, waxing, and tile replacement on the Parlor & Hallway floors (\$900) were completed.

User Groups: The AA Guide group has added a Tuesday meeting each week in room 10.

We have one very sad item to report on groups using the facilities. The Boy Scout troop we have worked with for over 50 years has not been re-chartered for 2025. Coming out of Covid was difficult, they were down to 2 scouts this year and had been having struggles finding new boys/girls and just as importantly, difficulty in finding parents that were interested in participating in the leadership of the troop. The two remaining scouts have been transferred to another troop and the Boy Scouts will begin vacating their room upstairs in the Fellowship Hall.
