Good News for Sunday School Ministry for Older Children

We are happy to announce that Dante Wilson will be working with preteens. He will be in the church worship service on the 1st and 3rd Sundays of the month.

Dante 's Introduction

Greetings to everyone at the First UMC in Canoga Park! I 'm Dante Wilson, and many of you already know me. I started attending this church with my late grandmother when I was 5 years old and served as an acolyte until I stopped attending during middle school. After a long absence, I returned to preach at my grandmother's funeral earlier this year.

There was a lot that happened in those several years, but long story short, I ended up becoming a Christian after I accepted the authenticity of God's Holy and inspired Scriptures by faith. I am very academically minded, and, wrestled with misunderstandings about the truth of the gospel. However, I am grateful for this struggle because it has allowed me to become more confident in my faith and to understand how the Spirit of God works through science and history.

God has used my testimony and the gifts He has given me to serve His eternal Kingdom and I plan to continue to do so for as long as I live. People often ask me if I will ever go to seminary and become ordained, and I always tell them that I have no idea. At the time of writing this, I am only 21 years old. But for the last 3 years I have been preaching in churches, teaching Sunday school classes, evangelizing in various communities, and ministering to those that God has put in my sphere of influence. The future plans that God has for me are still somewhat mysterious, but I know that I will always continue to do the work of the Great Commission while being motivated by the two Greatest Commandments.

This is why I am very grateful to find myself back at FUMC in Canoga Park. I will be teaching in the Sunday School program as we are trying to revive this part of the ministry. From my personal experience in this church, the disintegration of the Sunday School was largely responsible for why I stopped coming to church in the first place. Lord willing, and with all of our fervent prayers, the next generation can be blessed with the truth of God's Word through the gospel of Jesus Christ. I am particularly passionate about learning how to live a balanced and Holy life in a healthy way, especially during this time in our lives when immoral values unfortunately influence many people. I am very excited and I look forward to the time I will be able to invest in these endeavors. God bless you all!"



Advent Project

Between November 10th - December 8th, First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park will be collecting money or gift cards as our Advent Project* for The Woodlands Family Shelter. Congregants may purchase as many gift cards as they choose, but we ask that each gift card does not exceed \$25. These will be distributed to the families so they can purchase Christmas gifts, clothes, shoes, etc. for their children.

This Hope the Mission's family shelter is located in Woodland Hills. It is a 400-bed facility, currently housing 189 children. Each room has two bunk beds (four beds per room). Each room comes with a microwave, mini-fridge and bathroom. Residents are provided three meals per day, enrollment into schools for the children by LAUSD, daycare (when completed) for those too young to attend school as well as mental health services and clothes, if needed.

70% of The Woodlands residents have found permanent housing since they opened in May 2023!

Administrative Committee Reports

Facilities Update

We continue to work on the Fellowship Hall Gym LED light conversion project. We're becoming concerned that there is not enough energy savings to qualify for the LADWP rebate program. We should know soon.

We will be making a repair on a small section of the sanctuary ceiling that has pulled away and is starting to droop. We will be following that repair with some miscellaneous painting on patched areas in the building.

The Parlor floor has become harder and harder to clean so we will have it stripped and waxed in early November. All the arcade lights and lenses (under the overhang) on both sides of the sanctuary building were cleaned, bulbs replaced with LED bulbs as necessary, and one motion detector replaced. This included removing a few yellow bulbs. The effect at night is dramatic, with the church looking very bright and cheerful in the evening.

We've found a small patch of subterranean termites in one of the sprinkler valves covers and dry wood termites in the woodwork on the east wall of the sanctuary, where the monitors are attached, and up in the attic behind. We plan to do a local treatment in the attic and sprinkler box areas, but we'll wait until spring to go through the process of removing the monitors and doing a heat treatment on the east wall termites.

Financial Update

Following the close of the Stewardship Campaign we will begin the budgeting process for 2025. The initial rough draft will be done by November 12, and it will be finalized near year end

User Groups

We did our first tour for a special needs school as we hope to find a group to use the Fellowship Hall Gym and other rooms during the weekdays. Looking for the right group will probably take some time as not that many for profit groups are interested in shared use facilities. **Beyond the Lines Preschool** conducted a Trunk or Treat event in the parking lot on Friday, October 25 for Halloween.
