## **Immigration Detention & Incarceration: Migrants Speak**

I recently attended a Webinar on this subject. Approximately 120 persons attended. This webinar centered around the voices of migrants as they share personal experiences and insights on immigration detention and incarceration in the US. This discussion explored the challenges they face in the detention system, the impact on their lives and families, and the urgent need to reform. By hearing directly from impacted migrants (US, Philippines, Mexico & Iran) helps us gain a deeper understanding of the immigration system that keeps over 40,000 immigrants in detention facilities daily.

## Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship

2025 Applications Available Sunday December First



The Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship Committee begins its 41st season by announcing the availability of applications for scholarship grants to students who will be a junior or senior in college in the Fall of 2025. At least one \$1000 scholarship grant will be given on Easter

Sunday, April 20, 2025. Applications are available beginning Sunday, December 1, 2024. Request one from the First United Methodist Church office or by calling (818) 340-2950. Completed applications must be returned to the church office by Thursday, March 6, 2025 to be considered.

The Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship is given in loving memory of Laura Lynn Longman (1958 – 1984) who grew up in First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park. Laura was a vital member of our youth group, served as liturgist, sang in the choir, taught Sunday school and was well known by most members of the church. As a young adult she contracted heart disease and eventually underwent an experimental heart transplant. She was the 176th successful heart transplant patient at Stanford University Medical Center.

She returned to the life she loved as a college junior majoring in Biochemistry at San Francisco State University. It was there, in her classroom that Laura died at the age of 25. Laura's family and friends in the First United Methodist Church founded the Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship as a living memorial to celebrate her life and her love of learning. Laura died before she could finish her college education.

This scholarship is designed to help other students finish their undergraduate studies. The first scholarship grants were given on Easter Sunday, 1985. In the 40 years since then 124 Scholarship grants have been awarded to 97 individual students.

To the student who will be a junior or senior in the Fall of 2025 and who has a grade point average of 2.75 of 4.0 or better, we invite you to consider applying for this scholarship. You will give our congregation the opportunity to help you in your college endeavor. It will give you the opportunity to receive a grant of at least \$ 1,000 toward your scholastic expenses. Recent grants have been more generous.

For people who would like to support the Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship, contributions may be made in memory of Laura Longman, or in memory or honor of your family member or friend. Please make your check payable to the First United Methodist Church with a memo designating the Laura Longman Memorial Scholarship fund. If appropriate, attach a note that this contribution is in memory or honor of your special person. Your donation may be tax deductible. One hundred percent of your donation will be invested in scholarship benefits for students. We thank you in advance for your participation.

# **Advent Project**

Between November 10th - December 8th, First United Methodist Church of Canoga Park will be collecting money or gift cards as our Advent Project\* for The Woodlands Family Shelter. Congregants may purchase as many gift cards as they choose, but we ask that each gift card does not exceed \$25. These will be distributed to the families so they can purchase Christmas gifts, clothes, shoes, etc. for their children.

This Hope the Mission's family shelter is located in Woodland Hills. It is a 400-bed facility, currently housing 189 children. Each room has two bunk beds (four beds per room). Each room comes with a microwave, mini-fridge and bathroom. Residents are provided three meals per day, enrollment into schools for the children by LAUSD, daycare (when completed) for those too young to attend school as well as mental health services and clothes, if needed.

70% of The Woodlands residents have found permanent housing since they opened in May 2023!

# **Facility Update**

We continue to work on the Fellowship Hall Gym LED light conversion project. It looks like we may have to switch to an LADWP approved electrician to facilitate access to the rebate program that would pay for this \$12,000 project.

We repaired a small section of the sanctuary ceiling that has pulled away from the rafters. Following that repair we will do some miscellaneous painting on patched areas in the building.

We treated the Sacristy attic for wood termites as well as one area outside that had subterranean termites. The woodwork behind the monitors in the sanctuary will be treated next spring.


We had a handyman power spray the cement in front of the buildings and remove a lot of the spider webs that have been building up.

# Advent Book Study

The First Advent in Palestine

A four-week Advent study focused on liberation, sacred storytelling, and subversive hope, presented by the Cal-Pac Holy Land Strategy Group.

As we envision the first Advent, we often picture Mary and Joseph gathered by the manger, alongside angels, the magi, and shepherds beneath a radiant star. While these familiar images from scripture are sacred and important, there is still so much of the essential context of the original Advent story that is missing—as those who experienced the first Advent had to navigate through great darkness to reach the hope of Immanuel – God with us.

This Advent, join the Rev. Allison Mark and Rev. Mary Ann Pickard, as they lead a four-week Advent study based on the book The First Advent in Palestine: Reversals, Resistance, and the Ongoing Complexity of Hope, by Kelly Nikondeha.

Over four sessions, this study will invite us to revisit once again the geographic, socioeconomic, and political backdrop of Advent, so that we might encounter an Advent that feels real for today, and so that we can explore what it means to more fully stand in solidarity with the oppressed peoples of our world, both during Advent, and throughout all the seasons of the year.

This four-week study will be offered over zoom and will take place on Sunday evenings at 7pm, starting Sunday, December 1st, and going through Sunday December 22nd. All are welcome to join.
