Special Mission Recognition Tom Roe – June, 2015

Ten years ago United Methodist Women decided to recognize a man in our congregation by awarding him a UMW Special Mission Recognition Award for his hard work, volunteerism and dedication. This year the recipient was Tom Roe. He was

born in Santa Monica in 1942. His father was a master craftsman in wallpaper hanging whose clientele included many celebrities. His mother was a trained concert pianist who was devoted to God. The family moved to the west San Fernando Valley and lived in an army tent on a ranch until their new home was built. Tom was educated at schools in the west San Fernando Valley.

Tom loved taking care of horses and his father volunteered as a member of the Calabasas Mounted Sheriff's Posse. One of the horses Tom favored was named "Topper," Hopalong Cassidy's horse. He would go for long rides around the then largely undeveloped West Valley.

As a youth Tom participated in the YMCA's Christian-based "Ragger" Program, a seven-stage progression of spiritual and personal growth that involved peer counseling and symbolic bandanas. While each person develops his own goals for growth, each 'rag' challenges the individual to deeper awareness and personal growth. He continued with the YMCA in a leadership role into adulthood – caravanning youth to Yellowstone National Park, for example.

While attending Junior High he met his future wife. At Canoga Park High School, he participated in the Student Body Cabinet and was Club Chairman and Affairs Chairman for his senior class of 1960. He attended Pierce College and continued his education at Valley State, where he worked as a disc jockey and newscaster for KEDC, the student-run radio station. There he found his calling. He went on to host a radio show called "The Folk Festival" on KVFM for several years. By 1965 Tom was program director at KNJO in Thousand Oaks – the first radio station conceived and built for stereo in Southern California. Later he earned a BS degree in Business Management at Cal Lutheran.

In September 1967 he was commissioned as an officer in the US Army, just one year after he and Glynene were married in our church. In 1969, shortly after the birth of his first daughter, he was sent to Vietnam as a combat photographer. After completion of his military service, he re-entered radio. Due to his vivacious personality, he was a perfect fit for selling radio airtime. He called a number of radio stations home – such as KHTZ, KBIG, KZLA and KFWB. He had many professional achievements – President and Co-Founder of the General Sales Manager Council of Los Angeles. He enjoyed serving as a guest lecturer at CSUN, Cal Lutheran and UCLA.

He officially became a member of Canoga Park First UMC in 1980, but he supported this church many years prior to that. Over the years he has served on many committees - Parsonage, Staff Parish Relations, Property & Upkeep, Family Life and the 100th Anniversary Committee. He has served as liturgist, usher & counter for a number of years and is one of three financial secretaries. In the late 60's he taught Sunday School with June Nordman. He has been Master of Ceremonies at our BBQ's, Fellowship Hall Dedication Ceremony, Time Capsule Opening Ceremony, and Cornerstone Placing Ceremony. He is a member of the Men's Fellowship, driving members to and from the Men's Breakfast. He is a member of the church Audio Committee. He continues to serve on the West Hills Homeowners Association and the West Hills Fire Council.

Eagle Project

Hello. My name is Alexander Schwartz. I'm in the process of developing an Eagle Project at this church. The project will provide several benefits to the church. The new lawn sprinkler system will save water which is essential, because of the current drought. 

Born in Sacramento to Elmo and Olive Funke, Pat grew up in Curtis Park and graduated from UC Berkeley, where she met her future husband. A friend insisted she go on a blind date with a Navy man who was stationed on an LST in San Francisco Bay. She and Ralph hit it off and were married two years later on 27 June 1948, after Pat graduated from college.

Ralph went to work in Hollywood with his uncle, working on The *Buster Brown Gang* TV show and the *Lassie Show* on radio. Pat worked for a company that studied the purchases of homemakers for the LA Times.

Pat and Ralph bought their first home in Encino Park and later moved to Woodland Hills. They had five sons – Patrick who died in 1954, Thomas, James, Timothy, Jonathan – and one daughter, Elizabeth. Pat was very busy raising her children but found time to be involved with Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, Little League, her sorority alumnae group, PTA, YMCA, and the elementary school Reading Lab. When all the children were in school, she worked for the L.A. Unified School District with special needs children.

Pat was a phenomenal seamstress and voracious reader. She kept an extensive diary and checked her horoscope every day. She loved gardening, tending her roses, and teaching children about roses through the Gardening Angel program. She was an active member of the West Valley Garden Club and served as president for four years.

An avid sports fan, she loved the Lakers and Dodgers. On their 50th wedding anniversary, the whole family attended a Dodger Game to celebrate. Ralph and Pat's names were even in lights on the scoreboard.

Pat grew up in the Pioneer Congregational Church, one of the first churches formed in Sacramento.

Later, she and Ralph joined the Encino Presbyterian Church where both served as Deacons and Elders. They were members there for 45 years.

Both Pat and Ralph were liaisons from Encino Presbyterian Church for the Department of Children and Family Services and worked tirelessly gathering clothing and household items for DCFS. One day, while Pat was in Mervyn's department store in Canoga Park, she overheard someone in management talking about finding children to participate in a program where the children could get their back-to-school clothing. Pat spoke up: "I know where you can find some children." She pointed them to the Department of Children & Family Services. The program became the Back-To-School Shopping Spree now hosted by Kohl's department store.

In 2004, the Ferrins joined First UMC of Canoga Park, the church where her in-laws had been members. She joined the UMW and the Bookends Circle. She served as Treasurer of UMW and as a member of the Laura Longman Scholarship Committee. In 2013, Pat received a Special Mission Recognition Award presented by our UMW.

Faith sustained Pat through good times and bad. The church family shares each other's joys and sorrows. Together we laughed and cried; together we worshipped and praised God; together we marveled at the goodness of God.

Oh, how Pat loved to marvel! She so often asked me, Have you marveled today, that I started asking her the same question. Even in rehab, she marveled at people who came to visit, and she marveled at the many people who helped her each day. Even at the hospital, she marveled at being able to watch baseball with her son or to talk to loved ones on the phone.

I like to think about the marvelous things Pat has seen since she went home to be with God and gathered with the saints around the throne. She has seen God's face and Ralph. God's name is on their foreheads, and God will be their light forever and ever.


Haircut Day



Julie and Robert Mosely were welcomed on the first Sunday of August.


