Sunday Worship in January 2016

January 3 - Love Feast

In the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries, the Love Feast was a very important expression of Methodist spirituality. John Wesley borrowed and adapted it from the Moravians. The Love Feast is an informal time of worship that includes prayer, hymn singing, Scripture, testimony, and sharing bread and water. Since it is not sacramental like Communion, the Love Feast is often lead by a lay person. Sharing a Love Feast together will be a wonderful beginning to the new year!

January 10 - Reaffirmation of the Baptismal Covenant and SADAA

Sisters Against Drug and Alcohol Abuse (Robin Abernathy, Donna, Gloria and Terry) will be featured in worship. 

Shawn Matthew Alvarado's journey began back in May 2015, when his friend Jose told him about the Los Angeles Police Department's Cadet Program at the Topanga Police Station. The program meets every Tuesday and he could learn a lot of things that would help him become a better person. We all agreed to go and see what this program was all about. Shawn, Dylan and Dominic all wanted to be a part of the program. Shawn was considered a recruit, until he started his training in August.

Every Saturday for 18 weeks, he had to be at the Topanga Police Station at 6:00 am dressed in 1 of 3 different uniforms. During this time he attended classes, participated in physical activities and did volunteer work.

Shortly after Shawn started the program Dylan and Dominic began their journey as Junior Cadets. Hopefully they will continue and when they turn 13, they will also begin their training to become LAPD Cadets like their brother Shawn.

Shawn finished his training in December and was part of a graduating class of over 550 cadets in a ceremony at the Galen Center in Los Angeles. The graduation marked the end of his training and the beginning of a new life journey as Cadet Alvarado.

Jonathan Henry Ferrin 12 October 1962 – 2 August 2015



Jonathan worked at Rocketdyne on the J-2X rocket engine program. After evaluating the new nozzle design and all the previous designs, he designed some elegant tooling for the new nozzle. His creativity and

ingenuity were well-known and respected. He excelled at every job from Janitor to Tooling Designer to Combustion Devices Designer.

Jonathan was charismatic and had a good sense of humor and a beautiful heart. He was loving and kind and would help others when he could, whether it was a person or a Great Dane. A large black dog followed him home from school one day in Junior High and stayed. The dog even figured out how to climb up to the top bunk bed in order to sleep with Jonathan.

Jon enjoyed nature and painted watercolor landscapes of mountains, trees, and the sunset. He dabbled in photography and did a sculpture of Tom's head. He liked the electric guitar, Jimmy Hendrix, and building airplane models. And he loved to watch TV shows like *Star Trek*, *The Outer Limits*, *The Big Bang Theory*, and *The Twilight Zone*.

He was a devoted father who exposed Devin to karate, piano and more. Scouting was a big part of their life together. They always had the fastest cars in the Pinewood Derby, thanks to Jonathan's engineering skills. When it became necessary for Jon to move out of the family home, he missed Devin terribly.
