Finding God in a Bag of Groceries

Many of us have found meaning and pleasure in contributing and serving in ministries involving food. Our congregation, Canoga Park FUMC, collects canned goods for the SFV food pantry, and prepares and serves casseroles on Tuesdays in conjunction with our church's shower ministry. Many folks graciously take food to families during times of illness or bereavement, prepare food for fellowship time after church service, or sort and distribute groceries at the food bank.

Reaching out and helping others is something Jesus did himself and instructed us to do. Laura Willis writes about reaching out to those in need in her book, *Finding God in a Bag of Groceries*. She reminds us how the simple act of sharing groceries can literally change someone's life. This is a book about the ways that God works through us to help others and in turn enriches our own lives.

The author began by simply handing out bags of groceries to the needy in her rural town in Tennessee. There was no organized food bank with lots of volunteers; she worked out of a tiny building behind her church, collecting, bagging, and distributing food. In addition to distributing groceries, she also offered a loving heart and compassionate ear. Laura grew this tiny food ministry into a quite a large one manned by many, and in the process, she found her spiritual direction.

This short book can be found in our church library. It is a book that was read by the UMW group, Bookends. We enjoyed it and encourage you to check it out!

Betty Anne Barlow

27 August 1925—5 January 2018

Betty joined the church in 1964 and became a Charter member of United Methodist Women Canoga Park unit in 1973. During the subsequent 44 years she served as Secretary, Mission Coordinator for Supportive Community, Spiritual Growth Coordinator, and Treasurer.



She was a faithful member of the Bookends Circle from 1973 to 2017, serving as Bookends Communication Coordinator, Spiritual Growth Coordinator, Treasurer and Chairman.

In 1986 the UMW awarded her the Special Mission Recognition Award and the Mary/Martha Award in 1994.

She and Jack were long-time members of the Family Life Committee, contributing to our corporate lives in many ways. Betty also served on the Membership Committee for 12 years, from 1993-2005.

Betty Anne was born in Los Angeles on August 27, 1925. She was raised in Bishop and had spent the last 68 years living in the San Fernando Valley.

She was a registered nurse before becoming a fulltime housewife and mother.

A graveside service was held at the West Line Cemetery in Bishop on January 13.


